## Do you know?

### Korean Martyrs



The Roman Catholic faith came to Korea at the end of the 18th century, by the reading of some Catholic books written in Chinese. The strong and dynamic Catholic communities were led almost entirely by lay people until the arrival of the first French missionaries in 1836. The Catholic community suffered major persecutions in the years 1839, 1846 and 1866, producing at least 8,000 known martyrs. Among them were the fervent

Korean priest Andrew Kim Taegön and the Korean lay catechist Paul Chöng Hasang. The vast majority of the martyrs were simple lay people, including men and women, married and single, old and young. 79 martyrs of Korea were beatified in 1925 and 24 more were beatified in 1968 and the combined 103 martyrs were canonized in 1984, with their feast day set on September 20. Currently, Korea has the 4th largest number of saints in the Catholic world.

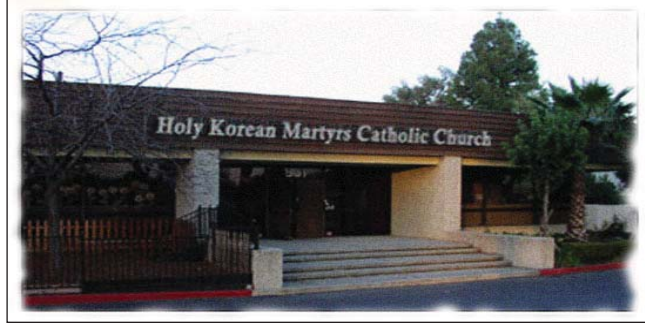

## Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



### Litruqy of the word

**Reading 1** - 1 Sm 3:3b-10, 19  
Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

Brothers and sisters:

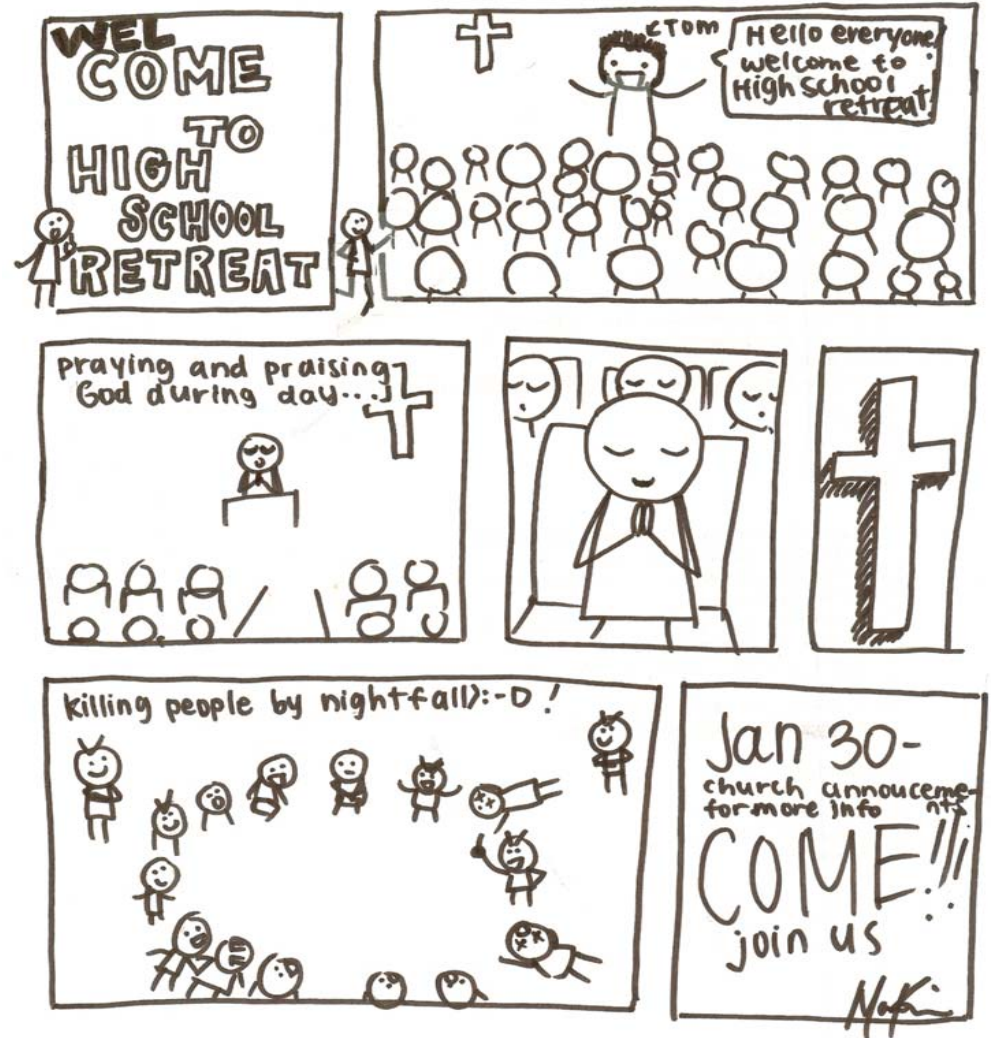
The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord,

Gospel - John 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples,  
 and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said,  
 "Behold, the Lamb of God."  
 The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus.  
 Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them,  
 "What are you looking for?"  
 They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —,  
 "where are you staying?"  
 He said to them, "Come, and you will see."  
 So they went and saw where Jesus was staying,  
 and they stayed with him that day.  
 It was about four in the afternoon.  
 Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter,  
 was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus.  
 He first found his own brother Simon and told him,  
 "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —.  
 Then he brought him to Jesus.  
 Jesus looked at him and said,  
 "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is trans-  
 lated Peter.
